# FIRST 5 ALAMEDA COUNTY'S ROLE IN THE EARLY CHILDHOOD SYSTEM OF CARE

#### Within the early childhood system, our role is to:



**FUND** organizations and initiatives that are mission- and vision-aligned, and part of a community-based, family-informed early childhood system.




**PARTNER** with parents, caregivers, communities, early childhood providers, organizations, and public agencies in service to an accessible, effective, and responsive early childhood system.



**ADMINISTER** programs for young children and families that offer services, navigation, and care coordination; support and connections to resources; and training and capacity building for providers.



**ADVOCATE** to scale and sustain effective programs and for public policies grounded in equity and justice.



## 1) Increase Access to Preschool

- 4-year-olds from low-income families
- 3-year-olds from low-income families



## 2) Improve Preschool Quality & Affordability

- All 4-year-olds
- All 3-year-olds



## 3) Expand Child Development Services

• Birth to age 3

#### Measure Success

 Assess how early education programs prepare kids for kindergarten

## **Support Teachers**

 Provide training and coaching to meet preschool quality standards

#### Maximize Resources

 Combine money from federal, state, and local sources

- Expand quality programs for those with the greatest need
- Reduce disparities











#### **EARLY EDUCATION FUND**

#### Highlights of Investments to Date (Jan. 2023 – Jul. 2025)

# \$30.1M INVESTED IN OAKLAND UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT (OUSD) \$12.5M INVESTED IN CITY OF OAKLAND HEAD START (COOHS)



\$15.1M invested in **Program & Site Staff** (e.g., teachers, Family Navigators)



\$2.4M invested in **ECE Workforce Development** (e.g., professional development training, coaching)



\$3.8M invested in **Administrative Staff** (e.g., Early Education Director, data analysts)



\$1.7M invested in **Family Outreach & Support Services**(e.g., home visiting, food services)



\$12.9M invested in **Site Maintenance & Improvements** (e.g., playground equipment, Kaiser Early Childhood Center renovations)



\$288K invested in classroom materials













### **Estimated Number of Children Served at OUSD and** COOHS in Fiscal Years 2022-23 and 2023-24



#### Reaching Young Children

~10,500 CHILDREN AGES
3 AND 4 LIVE IN OAKLAND

~5,500 CHILDREN AGES 3 AND 4 UNDER 85% SMI IN OAKLAND



**1 in 5 children** (ages 3-4) in Oakland are enrolled in a site funded by the Initiative's Early Education Fund



**1 in 3 children** (ages 3-4) under 85% SMI in Oakland are enrolled in a program funded by the Initiative's Early Education Fund
